'Hebel (לבֵהַ)' as temporary

Hebel is paralleled with "wind", also transitory or passing away.

Is 57:13 When you cry out, let your collection of idols deliver you!

The wind will carry them all off,
a breath will take them away.

But he who takes refuge in me shall possess the land
and shall inherit my holy mountain.

Job doesn't want to live forever, his days are just hebel.

Job 7:16 I loathe my life; I would not live forever. Leave me alone, for my days are a breath.

Hebel is translated "worthless", but with the clear idea of passing away.

Jer 10:15 & 51:18 They are worthless, a work of delusion; at the time of their punishment they shall perish.

Hebel is a breath that quickly passes away.

Ps 39:5 Behold, you have made my days a few handbreadths, and my lifetime is as nothing before you.
Surely all mankind stands as a mere breath!
Ps 39:11 When you discipline a man with rebukes for sin,
you consume like a moth what is dear to him; surely all mankind is a mere breath!
Ps 78:33 So he made their days vanish like^[a] a breath,^[b] and their years in terror.

Ps 144:4 Man is like a breath; his days are like a passing shadow.

Is beauty worthless or bad, or is it just fleeting? The idea of temporary would fit well.

Proverbs 31:30 Charm is deceitful, and beauty is vain, but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised.

Vain could be translated 'brief' and fit the context well:

Ecc 6:12 For who knows what is good for man while he lives the few days of his vain^[a] life, which he passes like a shadow? For who can tell man what will be after him under the sun? **Ecc 3:19** For what happens to the children of man and what happens to the beasts is the same; as one dies, so dies the other. They all have the same breath, and man has no advantage over the beasts, for all is vanity.^[a]

Ecc 7:15 In my vain^[a] life I have seen everything. There is a righteous man who perishes in his righteousness, and there is a wicked man who prolongs his life in his evildoing.

Ecc 9:9 Enjoy life with the wife whom you love, all the days of your vain^[a] life that he has given you under the sun, because that is your portion in life and in your toil at which you toil under the sun.

Ecc 11:8 So if a person lives many years, let him rejoice in them all; but let him remember that the days of darkness will be many. All that comes is vanity. [a]
